Impact

- The 2021 impact factor is now 1.490 (down from 1.689), and the 5 year one is 1.853 (down from 2.073). Both years are still record years.
- Downloads in 2022 decreased 6.5% after passing the 100k mark in 2021 (a spike of 28.5%). Both years are still record years.
- The number of institutions is now 6378 (down from 6757 in 2021).
